Welcome to the spring term at Evergreen. We have many new families joining us this term and with new children quickly settling into nursery and our existing children proudly embracing familiar routines, Evergreen is an exciting place to be. We offer a nurturing curiosity inspired environment, encouraging children to explore their surroundings with awe and wonder. Each child is supported to learn at their own pace and use their imagination.

We welcome Mrs Cabral into Maple room to join the growing team dedicated to nurture and inspire our youngest children.

We love to read! The children love to borrow a book to share at home from our Book Well in the nursery entrance. If you borrow a book please can we ask it is returned when you have finished enjoying it so the next family can share it too. If you have any unwanted books you could donate to our sharing library, we would be very grateful.

The children in Maple room have been busy making us very proud of how welcoming they are to the new children who have joined us this term, how keen they are to make new friendships and to embrace the routines.

This term we will continue learning through play-based activities on a new text each week which is shared in the entrance. Children will explore personal, social and emotional development with key books 'Rain Before Rainbows', 'Who are you?' and 'The Colour Monster' as well introduce early science concepts with 'Dear Zoo'.

Polite Reminders

Please can all children bring a named water bottle to each nursery session.

For hygiene reasons water bottles need to be taken home at the end of each session.

We kindly ask that toys are not brought into nursery to prevent them getting lost or damaged. Children are welcome to bring a small comforter to support them as needed.

Unless your child is booked into wrap around care, our afternoon session finishes at 3.15pm. We offer a later collection time of 3.25pm for a small cost which can be booked by emailing the office. Please collect your child from nursery before collecting older children from school.

On Monday mornings, we continue to have PE with Mr Newson. Please ensure your child has appropriate footwear on and are not wearing earrings so they are able to join in the fun.



This half term children in Oak room will be exploring early concepts of history, geography and RE through key texts 'All through the Night' and 'The Queen's Hat'. We will also be learning about space with our amazing book 'Astro Girl'.

We will continue learning a new phoneme each week in phonics following the Little Wandle scheme. Information on how to support your child develop their phonics skills can be found on the parent's page of the Little Wandle website. The children really benefit from practising the nursery rhymes in the videos found on the parent's section at home.

In Maths, we will be concentrating on quickly holding up the right number of fingers to match the numeral called out and exploring the patterns of dots on dice.

Outside Learning

Our children love learning outside. To keep them warm this term, please can all children bring a named, warm coat to nursery. Please can all gloves and hats be securely named too. Children are welcome to keep a pair of wellies at nursery so they can access our outside environment all year round.

Key person approach

In Evergreen we follow the key person approach and all children will have a named key worker alongside the room lead.

Key workers will share observations of your child's development using ARC.
