Each year the school receives a PE and Sport Grant from the Government.

At Abbots Green we support all our pupils and aim to use this money to improve the quality of the PE and Sport activity we offer to our pupils. PE and sport is very important to us at Abbots Green Primary and we pride ourselves on promoting physical activity, both within our PE lessons and during lunchtime and afterschool activities.

The PE and School Sport premium from the government has been greatly received and we plan to use the funds wisely to foster the children's lifelong love of sport. Within school we have an action plan outlining how we wish to use the money, baseline data we are collecting and evidence to show the positive impact of this funding.

Use of Funding 2020/21

The funding received from PE and Sport funding has enabled us to:

- Continue to be a member of the Bury School Sport Partnership which has involved participation in virtual school competitions and links to resources to access and share with children and staff during lockdown.
- When it was safe to do so, provide a scaled back offer of extra-curricular sports activities-Multisports club, Bike Ability, Balance bike.
- To ensure that children have access to appropriate equipment needed for PE curriculum.
- Provide children with opportunities to participate in sport and physical activity, both on school site and at home.
- Introduce 'Scrapstore Playpod' as a valuable lunchtime activity across the school.
- Further embed the PE curriculum and enrich this with intra-school competition.
- To further develop the use of Commando Joe within the PE curriculum.
- Develop cross curricular links, including PSHE & well-being, to ensure all children are 'healthy'.
- Use physical activity to support specific children in the classroom.
- To begin plans to install a daily mile track on the field.
- To develop a new PE uniform.

Impact of Pupil Premium Grant Spending 2019/2020

The funding has allowed us to see an improved sporting performance, increased participation and better promotion of health and well-being.

During an un-precidented year we were proud that, during lockdown, several of our pupils completed fundraising, utilising their love of sport. We continued to provide varied PE provision and challenges, for children both at home and in school bubbles. This meant that on returning to school, many of the children's skills had been retained.

Upon finalisation of building work, we were able to begin to develop the hall as a PE space. This will continue as the children return to lessons indoors.

The use of Commando Joe supported children with the transition back into school in a class group- cooperating, negotiating and using resilience.

The Gym trail was successful in supporting individual children with specific needs, includingconcentration, co-ordination and resilience.

Refreshing equipment allowed high quality delivery of the PE curriculum to continue.
