




# Pupil Premium Provision Map 2017-18

## To support Quality First Teaching and Specialist Support

The pupil premium is additional monies given to schools to support pupils who are considered disadvantaged. The chosen measure for this is the entitlement of Free School Meals within the past 6 years. The current Funding is £1,320 per pupil. £95,000 in total.

### Family Support Worker

Overview: Our Family Support works with families and children to provide pastoral care and support where needed.

Cost: £6584

Aim/Outcome: Families and children feel well supported by the school. Communication is a genuine and positive experience. Reduces absences and increases positive behaviour.

### Pupil Premium Progress Co-ordinator

Overview: Our Pupil Premium Progress Co-Ordinator works closely with teachers and children to identify and close gaps in attainment.

Cost: £25,980

Aim/Outcome: To monitor, support and deliver interventions to PP Children across the school to improve attainment and progress.

### Early Birds Breakfast Club

Overview: Provides pupils in KS2 safe and nurturing environment to arrive independently and share breakfast with peers.

Cost: £6584 + £550

Aim/Outcome: To create a positive start to the school day where KS2 pupils are well organised and ready to learn.

### Sand Tray Therapy and Counselling support

Overview: A supportive session to enable children to express or deal with any negative emotions.

Cost: Included in Pupil Premium Progress Co-ordinator

Aim/Outcome: To enable children freedom to explore their emotions and clear their mind, enabling them to be ready for learning within the classroom setting.

### Lego Therapy

Overview: Multi-sensory approach to teach valuable life skills.

Cost: £1,140

Aim/Outcome: Children develop social and communication skills, able to successfully follow and give instructions. Develops confidence and self-esteem.

### Supporting the Whole Child Well Being

### Uniform Voucher and Planner

Overview: Provision of £25 annual uniform voucher to all children in receipt of FSM

Cost: £2,225

Aim/Outcome: Raise aspirations, motivation and engagement and feeling of equality. Improve behaviour. Teach life and organisational skills.

### ELSA

Overview: to help children learn to understand their emotions and respect the feelings of others.

Cost: £3762 + £645

Aim/Outcome: Children will develop the necessary skills or coping strategies to think about their personal circumstances and how they can manage them.



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
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### Subsidised Trips

**Overview:** School trips and residential subsidised to ensure access for all pupils

**Cost:** £ 2,200

**Aim/Outcomes:** Raise aspiration, motivation and engagement. Improve behaviour. Give a purpose/meaning to learning Teach life skills

### Cooking Club

**Overview:** An afterschool club which enables children to cook a nutritious snack which can be taken home to eat/share.

**Cost:** Included in Pupil Premium Co-ordinators salary

**Aim/Outcome:** Children will learn about healthy eating options. Self-help and independence.

### Junior Road Safety Officers

**Overview:** Promote road safety issues within the school.

**Cost:** £200 + £15 + £35

**Aim/Outcome:** Increase self-esteem, aspiration and engagement. To have a sense of responsibility. Opportunity to attend awards ceremony.

### Music Lessons And Music Medley Performing Arts

**Overview:** Pupils in Year 5/6 can learn to play guitar, flute or violin or participate in extra-curricular performing arts club

**Cost:** £200 per term

**Aim/Outcome:** Increase self-esteem and provide pupils with cultural and enriching experiences.

### OLE Days

**Overview:** Outdoor Learning Experience Days

**Cost:** £10 per hour (Additional Staffing costs)

**Aim/Outcome:** Learning outdoors provides memorable experiences and allows children the opportunity to learn using natural resources and in settings that may otherwise be unavailable.

### Forest Schools

**Overview:** Specialised Learning approach that offers all learners the opportunity to achieve and develop confidence and self esteem

**Cost:** £15,000 + £1065 + £365 +£10 per hour additional support staff

**Aim/Outcome:** Children are free to flourish as individuals without academic pressures and experience appropriate risk and challenge.

### Talk Team

**Overview:** Provides children with the opportunity to have their views and opinions heard and to represent those of others.

**Cost:** £300 + £60

**Aim/Outcome:** Promotes British Values and sense of identity. Increased self-esteem.

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

### Small Group Tutoring

Overview: Pupils in year 6 to receive additional tuition from teachers to fill the gaps in preparation for SATS and teachers timetabled to take small groups of vulnerable children throughout the year.

Cost: £8,311 and £1,900

Aim/Outcome: Give children confidence in their abilities to cope with year 6 expectations and increase rate of progress.

### Special Education Needs Co-Ordinator

Overview: A large proportion of PP pupils also have SEN. Our Senco is non-class based ensuring pupils receive the highest quality teaching and specialist provision.

Aim/Outcome: Increased progress for PP Children with SEN closing of the achievement gap.

Aim/Outcome: Increased progress for PP with SEN, Closing the achievement

### Catch Up Numeracy and Literacy Interventions

Overview: Designed for use with children whose reading/number age is significantly below their chronological age.

Cost: £395 + £95

Aim/Outcome: Find and replace gaps in mathematical understanding, word recognition process and language comprehension.

### Reading Comprehension Booster Groups

Overview: To encourage children to read for meaning.

Cost: Included in PP Co-ordinator salary

Aim/Outcome: Give children strategies to read for meaning with a variety of different texts.

### LetterBox Club

Overview: To provide children with a range of high quality and current maths and literacy resources.

Cost: £645

Aim/Outcome: Will allow children the opportunity to share academic resources in a relaxed and informal environment. Encourage reading for pleasure.

### Nessy Reading and Spelling Programme

Overview: Reading/Spelling and Dyslexia Quest ICT intervention to support pupils who find reading and spelling a challenge.

Cost: £1330

Aim/Outcome: Allows struggling readers and spellers a different approach to learning to read and spell.

### Welcom

Overview: Speech/Language Support

Cost: £3,762

Aim/Outcome: Early identification and intervention to support those with a barrier to spoken language
